HAPPY & HEALTHY

Attached to this newsletter new parents will find a copy of our healthy eating policy (also on our website). Without a good healthy breakfast it is very hard for many children to concentrate and give their best in class in the early part of the day. We notice a lot of children are coming to school without breakfast and are then eating lots at little break and have little left at big break.



It is very clear that only <u>a small treat</u> is allowed per lunchbox on a Friday. (No crisps or fizzy drinks). We appeal to all parents **not to send in food to share with the rest of the class on a Friday** as this defeats the purpose of our whole policy.

Finally, lack of sleep is also impacting on many of the children, with some children telling us they watch television, play games and text late into the night (and early morning). Naturally this impacts on their engagement with school life and we are bringing this to your attention as the pupils themselves say their parents think they are fast asleep when this is happening. Over to you, parents!

COPPERS FOR COMPUTERS



We continue to progress on our Digital School strategy and our recent recognition as a Digital School of Distinction is a source of great pride for us. Some years ago, we never dreamed we would have a state of the art computer room as well as interactive whiteboards in all classes. However, many of these whiteboards are now reaching the end of

their natural life and we will prepare a budget and a fundraising plan in the near future to replace whiteboards and projectors which are failing. Along with this major expenditure, we also need to continue to replace computer accessories and software, which are a constant drain on our IT funds received as Part B of the Booklist. We plan to resurrect our **Coppers for Computers** idea which was so successful when we were fundraising for the school extension. All we ask is for all of us – teachers, children, parents and others to collect any loose change we find at home or at school. We don't ever do door to door collections, but please ask aunties, uncles,

grannies and grandads to help with this. We also have labels with our school logo, which can be placed in a workplace if you are willing to do so. Just ask!

The amount collected each week will be totalled and we'll let the children know each week how we're doing. Ar aghaidh le chéile!

For the month of December we'll suspend our Coppers for Computers campaign and donate all money collected to BÓTHAR, one of our annually supported charities, but more on that later.

EDUCATION WELFARE ACT

Under this act schools are obliged to report to the National Education Welfare Board the name of any child who misses 20 school days or more in any given year. Parents are also obliged to inform the school, in writing, of the date/s and reason/s why children are absent. So, if your child is absent from school, from now on an absence note in the homework journal must be filled out when your child returns to school. Please don't send a child to school following an absence without a note. We ask all pupils to make a special effort to be in school every day unless they are sick, in which case the best place for them is at home.
