As the Carol Service will take place in the Oratory, there will be **no food or drink**. We look forward to a full attendance of pupils in school uniform as we all share the true meaning of Christmas at the Carol Service. It really is a very special night in our school year, so **please be in the oratory early to be sure of a seat**. Over the past few years we have had problems when children didn't turn up on the night, leaving a depleted choir to sing their class carol. If your child can't come on the evening, please let the class teacher know **in writing in advance**. However, our Carol Service is a whole school preparation for Christmas and we would love to see all the children gathering together on this one night of the year.

**CHRISTMAS SPIRIT      SPIORAD NA NOLLAG**

Our Advent wreath is lit in school every morning. The **circle of evergreen leaves** stands for God's everlasting love which is without beginning and without end. The **four candles** - one for each week of Advent - symbolise our waiting to welcome Jesus Christ. The three purple candles stand for penance and sorrow for sin. The **rose coloured candle** stands for the joy of living in God's way of love. The white candle stands for Jesus' birthday on December 25<sup>th</sup>. The **red ribbon** stands for Jesus' blood shed on the cross for love of us. In order to fully celebrate the birth of Jesus, we will send home the Christmas schedule of Masses and Services in St. Attracta's Oratory. We also look forward to this year's Christmas Eve Children's Liturgy at 6.30p.m. in the Oratory on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup>. The Sunday Choir will help make our Christmas Eve Mass a memorable one and we look forward to seeing you there. At this time of year, we thank all the boys and girls who read, sing or serve Mass for their commitment to the Sunday Masses.

## ÉIRE - PREPARING FOR 2016

To commemorate the centenary of the 1916 Rising and to celebrate 100 years since the Proclamation of the Irish Republic, the Government has tasked Óglaigh na hÉireann with delivering a National Flag to every Primary School in the country.



Last Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> November, in St. Attracta's Senior National School, Dan Coughlan and Cian Hill welcomed members of the Army and the Air Corps to our school. We were particularly pleased to welcome two of our past pupils - Captain Mark Conway and Captain Michael Barcoe - who along with Flight Sergeant Ollie McKeown and Lt. Paul McDermott presented the National Flag and a copy of the 1916 Proclamation of Independence to our pupils. Passing through a guard of Honour formed by our Student Council, the officers entered the Halla to a rousing Senior School welcome. They then proudly read the Proclamation to the children, while two of our pupils - Donal Kelly and Hannah Turner Doyle - read the 4<sup>th</sup> paragraph of the Proclamation, which refers to *cherishing all the children of the nation equally*.

The National Flag - Bratach na hÉireann - was then formally presented to the school and Ronan McKenna and Anna Girika accepted the flag on behalf of all the pupils. The proclamation was then presented to Céile Ashe and Aidan Colbert, direct descendants of Thomas Ashe and Con Colbert who fought in 1916. In the next few months the children will write a new proclamation for our country. As we look forward to celebrating the centenary of the 1916 Rising, we also celebrate all that makes us Irish and all that binds us together as a nation. This was a proud moment in the history of our school and in the history of our nation. At the end of the ceremony, all pupils, teachers and school staff joined together in singing Amhrán na bhFiann - united in voice and hearts.

Later in the school year, the celebrations will culminate in Proclamation Day on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2016, where every school throughout the country will raise the National Flag in a special ceremony - following the example of Óglaigh na hÉireann - and the 1916 Proclamation will be read. In tandem with this work, children in all classes are gradually learning all about the events of Easter 1916 and finding out many interesting facts about their ancestors' connections with these historic events. A selection of the children's work - symbols of Ireland, projects on 1916 and the children's thoughts on *What Being Irish Means to Me* - was displayed in the Halla on Friday.
