NEW SECRETARY



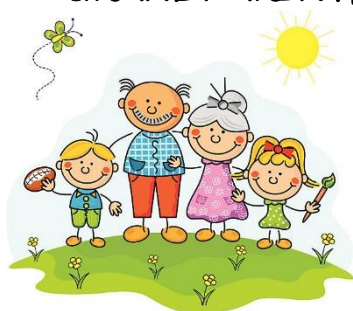

- ✚ Help your child to problem solve. Don't do it for them!
- ✚ Stay Calm.
- ✚ Practice relaxation exercises with your child.
- ✚ Never give up!
