Dear Parents,



RAINBOWS



Rainbows is a dedicated free service for children and young people. The Rainbows programme supports children affected by loss because of bereavement, separation or divorce.

St. Attracta's Senior School will be a dedicated Rainbows Site from September 2014. We hope to be in a position to facilitate any children attending either of our two schools, and other children in the surrounding area who may have suffered a recent loss.

This message is twofold:

- ✚ Firstly to make you aware that this service will be available to your child/children in September. A dedicated letter will be sent to each family nearer the time to alert you to the times, dates etc.
- ✚ Secondly we need to fundraise in order to run the programme. This is the first time we have done this in St. Attracta's School. All our facilitators are voluntary and give of their free time for nothing. However, we need to buy materials for the children. Some of you may be running or walking in the forthcoming Mini-marathon. If you have not decided on a charity yet perhaps you might consider Rainbows. Also we will have a Rainbows Awareness Day at the end of April, when we will explain Rainbows to the children. Some children from our school have already experienced a Rainbows programme in Ballinteer and have benefited hugely from this. We'll also run a Rainbows Dress-Up day when we will encourage children to dress up in as many colours as they can and we'll look for a donation of €2 per child to set up our Rainbows Centre.

Look out for further information about the Rainbows Programme. Signs will also be posted on the entrance door.

THE WAY OF THE CROSS: THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS CEREMONY

All parents are invited to attend the children's presentation of the Stations of the Cross at 11.00a.m. on this Friday 11th April. (School closes at 12 noon.) As the pupils are not in school during Holy Week, we feel this is a fitting way to mark Good Friday - even it is a week early! All are welcome! Fáilte!



And then a week later - on Good Friday itself - we will have a dramatisation of the story of Jesus Christ's passion and death. This will take place in the Oratory at 7.30p.m. on Friday 18th April and will involve pupils, past pupils and young adults with music provided by Joe Dunne and the Folk Group (joined by our own pupils).


BINGO
