

STRANGER DANGER

As the evenings grow darker once again we ask parents to tell your children to be careful when going home. We ask the children to follow this advice:

- Leave promptly after school ends
- Don't walk home alone, if possible
- Follow a route approved by you
- When crossing the Broadford Road, cross with the lollipop lady

and at all times

- Avoid talking to strangers
- Avoid approaching cars or vans they don't recognize or speaking to people they don't know.



It is very important that in unforeseen circumstances, children should know exactly what procedures to follow. Make sure your child knows exactly where to go after school and where to meet you if being collected. In the event of extra-curricular activities etc. being cancelled, children are encouraged to use the school phone to contact parents. We ask all parents to equip their children with the necessary skills to deal with situations where they don't feel safe or where they feel uncomfortable. We also work on this in school on a regular basis.
