The girls pushed on in the second half and were victorious at the final whistle, winning on a scoreline of St. Attracta's 2 Rush NS 1. Amy Clarke got our all-important winning goal. On Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March, our U11 girls team represented Dublin in the Leinster Olympic Handball Finals.
